SCHEDULE.

DESCRIPTION OF BOUNDARIES OF PROPOSED TOWN DISTRICT OF WAIKUMETE.

ALL that area in the Auckland Land District bounded by a line commencing at a point on the Oratia Stream where it is crossed by the Auckland-Kaipara Railway; thence along the said railway-line to the middle of the road forming the
