Notice of Intention to change the Purpose of Portion of a Travelling-stock Reserve in Mangaone Survey District, Wellington Land District.

WHEREAS the land described in the Schedule hereto forms portion of a reserve heretofore duly set apart as a resting-place for travelling stock, being a purpose within Class II of the Second Schedule to the Public Reserves and Domains Act, 1908:

And whereas it is expedient that the purpose of the portion of the said reserve should be changed to a reserve for gravel purposes:

These sections are situated in the Gladstone Block, in the vicinity of Pokako Railway-station, on the Main Trunk Railway, about three miles north of Horopito West Township. With the exception of Sections, 2, 3, and 4, which have access by the Mangaturuturu Road which is formed, all front the Main Trunk Road. They comprise bush lands, at an altitude of about 2,600 ft. above sea-level. About 40 acres on Section 2 and about 20 acres on Section 7 were felled some years ago, and areas have been felled and grassed on other sections as follows: On Section 3, about 15 acres; on Section 4, about 15 acres; on Section 5, about 24 acres; and on Section 13, about 8 acres. The forest comprises tawhero for the most part, with some rimu, silver-pine, &c.
