H18 EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

W HEREAS by section forty-seven of the Customs Act, 1913, as extended by section twenty-four of the Regulation of Trade and Commerce Act, 1914, it is enacted that the Governor-General may from time to time, by Order in Council gazetted, prohibit the exportation of any goods the prohibition of the exportation of which is in his opinion necessary in the public interest:

And whereas in the opinion of the Governor-General it is necessary in the public interest that the expertation of gela-tine and glue should be prohibited to the extent and in the

manner hereinafter appearing : Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and excreise of

the powers and authorities conferred upon him by section forty-seven of the Customs Act, 1913, and section twenty-four of the Regulation of Trade and Commerce Act, 1914, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of that Dominion, doth hereby pro-hibit the exportation of gelatine and glue from the said Dominion, save with the consent of the Minister of Customs.

WHEREAS by subsection one of section one hundred and seventeen of the Public Works Act, 1908, it is, inter alia, provided that the said section shall not apply in any case where the local authority having control of a road or street by resolution declares that the provisions thereof shall not apply to any specified road or street, or any specified part thereof, and such resolution is approved by the Governor-General in Council:

And whereas by subsection two of section one hundred and seventeen of the Public Works Act, 1908, and clause (b) of subsection one of section thirteen of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1911, it is provided that such approval may be either absolute or subject to such conditions with respect to the building-line as the Governor-General by Order in Council thinks fit to impose, and may refer to one or both

Council thinks fit to impose, and may refer to one or both sides of the road or street: And whereas the Waimea County Council, the local autho-rity having control of the said portion of road, described in the Schedule hereto, hereinafter referred to as the said portion of road, has passed the following resolution—viz., "That the Waimea County Council, being the local authority having control of that portion of the public road between Sections 3, 106, and 108, Block XII, Motueka Survey Dis-trict, by resolution declares that the provisions of section one trict, by resolution declares that the provisions of section one hundred and seventeen of the Public Works Act, 1908, shall not apply to the eastern side of the said public road which fronts Lot 1 of Sections 3 and 106:

And whereas it is deemed expedient that such resolution should be approved in so far as it refers to the eastern side of the said road, subject to the condition hereinafter mentioned :

tioned: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the above-in-part-recited Acts, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the said resolution to the extent hereinbefore mentioned, sub-ject to the condition that no building, or part of a building, shall be erected at any time on the eastern side of the said read within a distance of thirty-three feet of the centre-line road within a distance of thirty-three feet of the centre line of the said road.
