AUCKLAND HARBOUR.-ORAKEI WHARF LIGHT.

Marine Department, Wellington, N.Z., 25th September, 1918. THE Auckland Harbour Board have notified that a red sector will be shown in the light at the end of Orakei Wharf to assist the masters of the ferry steamers to keep older of the backgroup at the orable of the Orakei source outfall clear of the beacons at the end of the Orakei sewer outfall.
