LIVERPOOL, Governor-General.

In pursuance of section twelve of the Public Health Act, 1908, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby declare the disease called or known as influenza to be an infectious disease within the meaning of the said Act.
