Fixing the Maximum Retail Prices of Vegetables, Apples and Fish in New Zealand.

LIVERPOOL, Governor-General.
ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this twenty-first day of November, 1918.

#### Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

In pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on him by the Regulation of Trade and Commerce Act, 1914, as amended by section twenty-one of the Statute Law Amendment Act, 1917, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of that Dominion, doth hereby fix and determine, in accordance with the provisions of the Schedule hereto, the maximum retail prices of vegetables, apples, and fish respectively in New Zealand.

#### SCHEDULE.

The maximum retail prices of vegetables, apples, and fish in New Zealand shall be the standard prices thereof on the 1st day of November, 1918—that is to say, in respect of any locality the current price at which on that day goods of the same nature and quality were saleable in that locality when sold in the same quantity and on the same terms as to payment, delivery, and otherwise.

#### LIVERPOOL, Governor-General.

HEREAS by the Regulation of Trade and Commerce Act, 1914, it is provided that at any time when His Majesty is at war with any foreign Prince or State it shall be lawful for the Governor-General, whenever he deems it necessary in the public interest so to do, by Warrant under his hand, to authorize and direct any person to whom the Warrant is addressed to seize and take possession on behalf and for the use of His Majesty of any goods or class of goods specified or described in the Warrant:

And whereas His Majesty is now at war with a foreign State, and the Governor-General deems it necessary in the public interest to seize and take possession on behalf and for the use of His Majesty of oranges, lemons, vegetables, apples, and fish in New Zealand:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do by these presents empower, authorize, and direct you, John O'Donovan, Commissioner of Police, and all constables and other persons acting by your direction, to seize and take possession on behalf and for the use of His Majesty of any oranges, lemons, vegetables, apples, and fish in New Zealand.

As witness the hand of His Excellency the Governor-General, this twenty-first day of November, one thousand nine hundred and eighteen.
