**STRATFORD BOROUGH COUNCIL.**

**RESOLUTION MAKING SPECIAL RATE.**

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it in that behalf by the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1913, the Stratford Borough Council hereby resolves as follows:—

That, for the purpose of providing the interest and sinking fund and other charges on a loan of fifteen thousand pounds (£15,000), authorized to be raised by the Stratford Borough Council, under the above-mentioned Act, for the purpose of reconstructing with concrete, and such other materials as the Council shall think fit, the undermentioned streets or portions of streets within the Borough of Stratford—viz., Broadway, for its entire length; the portions of Fenton Street and Regan Street lying between Juliet Street and Broadway; and the portion of Juliet Street lying between Regan Street and Fenton Street—the said Stratford Borough Council hereby makes and levies a special rate of one penny and one-eighth of a penny (1 $\frac{1}{8}$ d.) in the pound upon the rateable value (on the basis of the unimproved value) of all rateable property in the Borough of Stratford. And that such special rate shall be an annually recurring rate during the currency of such loan, or any part thereof, and be payable half-yearly on the first day of March and the first day of September in each and every year during the currency of such loan, or any part thereof, being a period of ten years, or until the loan is fully paid off.
