The warning consists of the repeating of the words 'Point Judith Light,' every five seconds, with limit of range of about 8 miles. After every third repetition of the warning, 'You are getting closer; keep off' is sent out with a limit of range of about 2 miles.

"The apparatus required for the reception of the warning signals is an ordinary radio receiver. Crystal detectors may be used. The wave-length is varied continuously between 550 and 650 meters.
