Regulations made under the Census and Statistics Act, 1910.

LIVERPOOL, Governor-General.

IN exercise of the powers vested in me by the Census and Statistics Act, 1910, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby make, the following regulations prescribing additional matters in regard to which the Statistician shall collect statistics.

REGULATIONS.

- 1. In addition to the matters specified in paragraphs (a) to (j) of section 21 of the Census and Statistics Act, 1910, and in any other regulations heretofore made under that Act, the Statistician shall, subject to that section, collect statistics in regard to stocks, orders, and requirements of turnip, swede, and rape seed.
- 2. Every person holding stocks of turnip, swede, or rape seed, and every person having orders placed for supplies of turnip, swede, or rape seed direct from the United Kingdom, shall on request, within such time or times as he may be required by the Statistician so to do, furnish particulars as to the quantities and varieties thereof at a date or dates to be specified by the Statistician, together with details as to his usual annual requirements.
- 3. In order to comply with the last preceding regulation every such person shall fill up and supply to the Statistician, or to any officer authorized by him in writing, the particulars specified in the form set out in the Schedule hereto, in accordance with the instructions accompanying that form, and shall sign the form certifying to the correctness of the particulars entered therein.
