Amending Regulations under Prisons Act.

A PROCLAMATION

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon me by the Prisons Act, 1908, and of every other power and authority enabling me in this behalf, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby amend the regulations made under the said Act on the fourteenth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, and published in the *Gazette* of the twenty-third day of January, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, by substituting the words "Inspector of Prisons" for the word "Under-Secretary" wherever it occurs therein.

Additional Regulations under the War Pensions Act, 1915

LIVERPOOL, Governor-General.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this eighth day of April, 1918.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred on him by the War Pensions Act, 1915 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following additional regulations for the purposes of the said Act, as amended by the War Pensions Amendment Act, 1917.

REGULATIONS.

INTERPRETATION.

1. In these regulations "the Amendment Act, 1917," means the War Pensions Amendment Act, 1917.

SUPPLEMENTARY PENSIONS.

2. Application by a disabled member of the Forces for an increased pension under section 4 of the Amendment Act, 1917, shall be made in the form provided for the purpose, and shall be lodged with the nearest Registrar of Pensions, who shall forward it to the Commissioner of Pensions for submission to the War Pensions Board.
