Amended Regulations under the Coal-mines Acts.

LIVERPOOL, Governor-General.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this thirteenth day of May, 1918.

Present : HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on him by the Coal mines Ast 1000 million of the conferred on him The points and excites a state of the powers conteried on him by the Coal-mines Act, 1908, and the Coal-mines Amend-ment Act, 1914 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act and its amendments"), His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following amendment to the regulations made under the said Act and its amendments on the twenty-sixth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the first day of July then instant; and doth hereby order that the amend ment to the regulations hereby made shall be read as part of the said principal regulations and shall come into force on the said principal regulations, and shall come into force on the day of the gazetting hereof.

REGULATIONS.

REGULATION 134 (1) is amended as follows: At the end of the first paragraph thereof insert the following new para-

graph,— "During the period of the present war and for six months thereafter any explosive approved in writing by the Minister of Mines shall be deemed to be a 'permitted explosive' within the meaning and for the purposes of the said regula-

The provisions of paragraph (e) of regulation 129 shall not apply to any explosive so approved.
