
The attached diagram represents graphically the foregoing

PORT OF NEWCASTLE.—ALTERATION IN FAIRWAY LEADING-MARKS FOR NEWCASTLE HARBOUR.

NOTICE is hereby given that on the 1st June, 1918, the use of the present fairway leading-marks at the Port of New-

castle will be discontinued, and new leading-marks of the following description will be brought into use in their stead:—

Front Tower.—Structure: Steel lattice-work tower, painted

white. Position: Immediately at the back of Market Wharf. Character of light: Fixed red electric light. Height of light above mean sea-level: 107½ ft.

Back Tower.—Structure: Steel lattice-work tower, painted red. Position: West end of Church Street. Character of light: Fixed white electric light. Height of light above

mean sea-level: 167, ft.

In order to make these lattice-work towers as conspicuous as possible for daylight marks, an area of 30 ft. vertically by 7 ft. horizontally (at upper end) will show a solid white surface.

These fairway leading-marks are placed 1,042 ft. apart, and when in line bear south 47° west, correct magnetic, and indicate practically a centre-line through the entrance of Newcastle Harbour.
