Notice of Result of Poll on Proposal to raise a Loan under the Provisions of the Foxton Harbour Board Amendment Act, 1917.

PURSUANT to section 12 of the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1913, I hereby give notice that at a poll of ratepayers of the Foxton Harbour District taken on the 21st day of May, 1918, on the proposal of the Foxton Harbour Board to borrow the sum of £16,000 for the purposes of—

- (1.) The payment by the Board to His Majesty the King of the sum of £5,000, for the transfer of the lands and assets mentioned in section 8 of the Foxton Harbour Board Amendment Act, 1917;
- (2.) The construction and purchase of a dredge, and the construction and performance of the works, or any of them, authorized by section 9 of the Foxton Harbour Board Amendment Act, 1917—
