A PROCLAMATION.

Duty on certain Tobacco imported into the Cook Islands.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings at Wellington, this tenth day of June, 1918.

THE HONOURABLE SIR JAMES ALLEN, K.C.B., PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section three hundred and two of the Customs Act, 1913, it is enacted that the Governor-General may from time to time by Order in Council modify the Tariff in its application to goods imported into the Cook Islands, but so that such modification shall not have the effect of imposing higher duties than those imposed by the Tariff:

And whereas by Order in Council dated the thirtieth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and eighteen, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the thirty-first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and eighteen, the Tariff was modified in its application to certain tobacco imported into the Cook Islands:

And whereas it is expedient to amend the modification of the Tariff contained in the said Order in Council of the thirtieth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and eighteen:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by section three hundred and two of the Customs Act, 1913, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Dominion of New Zealand, doth hereby revoke the said Order in Council of the thirtieth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and eighteen, and doth hereby modify the Tariff in its application to goods imported
