Native Minister, any Maori Council has failed properly to carry out the duties imposed upon it by section eight of the Maori Councils Amendment Act. 1903, with respect to the registration of dogs, or to enter into an arrangement with a European local authority as authorized by that section, the Governor-General may by Order in Council confer upon any such European local authority all the powers and functions

of the Maori Council with respect to the registration of dogs in the district of that Maori Council : And whereas the Native Minister is of opinion that the Tauranga Maori Council has failed properly to carry out its duties with respect to the registration of dogs owned by Maorie or to entry into an experiment with a European local Maoris, or to enter into an agreement with a European local authority as authorized as aforesaid :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by section sixteen of the Native Land Amendment and Native Land Claims Adjustment Act, 1916, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby confer all the powers and functions with regard to the registration of dogs hitherto held by the Tauranga Maori Council upon the Tauranga County Council.
