#### A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the lands described in the first column of the Schedule hereto were, by Warrants the dates of which are specified in the second column of the said Schedule, and the notifications of which were published in the Gazettes specified in the third column, permanently set apart as reserves for scenic purposes under the provisions of the Land Act, 1892: And whereas it is expedient that the said lands should be declared reserves under the Scenery Preservation Act,

Now, therefore, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by section twelve of the Scenery Preservation Amendment Act, 1910, do hereby proclaim and declare that the lands described in the first column of the Schedule hereto shall, from and after the date hereof, be seenic reserves under the Scenery Preservation Act. 1908, and its amendments.
