Notice of Intention to take Land in Block XVI, Matakaoa Survey District, for the Purposes of a Native School.

NOTICE is hereby given that it is proposed, under the provisions of the Public Works Act, 1908, to execute a certain public work—to wit, the construction of a Native school in Block XVI, Matakaoa Survey District; and for the purposes of such public work the land described in the Schedule hereto is required to be taken.
