

SCHEDULE.

CANTERBURY LAND DISTRICT.

ALL that area in the Canterbury Land District, containing by admeasurement 5 acres 1 rood 3 perches, more or less, being Reserve 4025, Block IV, Geraldine Survey District, formerly Sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 7, 8, 9, and 10, Block IX, South Rangitata Township, Sections 4, 5, 6, 7, 11, 12, 13, and 14, Block X, South Rangitata Township, and a closed road formerly portion of Edward Street in the aforesaid township. WHEREAS, by notice issued pursuant to section six of the Public Reserves and Domains Act, 1908, dated the sixth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and eighteen, and published in the *Gazette* of the eleventh day of

April, one thousand nine hundred and eighteen, the purpose for which the reserve described in the Schedule hereto was set apart was changed from a site for a drill-shed to a site for public buildings of the General Government:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby notify that no such resolution as aforesaid has been passed by either House of Parliament, and that the change of purpose as set forth in the notice aforesaid has taken effect accordingly as from the tenth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and eighteen (being the date of the termination of the session during which the notice aforesaid was laid before Parliament).
