WHEREAS by subsection six of section thirty-four of the War Legislation and Statute Law Amendment Act, 1918 (being part of the State Forests Act, 1908), the Go vernor-General in Council is empowered to make regulations prohibiting the sale of standing timber, or the grant of licenses to cut standing timber, on public or private lands of any tenure, except subject to such conditions as may be

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on him as aforesaid, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of that Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations for the purposes aforesaid; and doth hereby declare that these regulations shall come into force on the date of the publication thereof in the *Gazette*.

REGULATIONS.

1. It shall not be lawful for any person to sell any timber standing on any public or private land of any tenure, or to grant a license to cut any timber standing on any such land, except pursuant to a license issued in that behalf by the Governor-General in Council.

2. Any license issued by the Governor-General in Council and at these regulations may be in like memory revealed.

ander these regulations may be in like manner revoked.

3. Every person who sells any standing timber, or who grants a license to cut any standing timber, contrary to the provisions of these regulations commits an offence against these regulations, and shall be liable for each offence to a fine of £50.
