The Council further resolved that section one hundred and seventeen of the Public Works Act, 1908, shall not apply to the portion of Willis Street lying between Palmer Street and Aro Street, nor to the portion of Aro Street to which Town Acres 46 and 48 have a frontage; subject, however, to the building-line being set back thirtysubject, however, to the building-line being set back thirty three feet from the centre-line of the streets as far as concerns the portions of streets above defined":

And whereas it is deemed expedient that such resolution should be approved in so far as it refers to the western and northern sides of the said portions of streets, subject to the

condition hereinafter mentioned: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the above-in-part-recited Acts, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the said resolution to the extent hereinbefore mentioned, subject to the condition that no building, or part of a building, shall be erected at any time on the western and northern sides of the said portions of streets within a distance of thirty-three feet of the centre-line of the said portions of streets.

Prohibiting the Importation of Tungsten and its Alloys and Compounds, also Tungsten Ores.

WHEREAS by section forty-six of the Customs Act, 1913, as extended by section two of the Regulation VV 1913, as extended by section two of the Regulation of Trade and Commerce Amendment Act, 1915, it is enacted that the Governor-General may from time to time, by Order in Council, prohibit the importation into New Zealand of any goods the prohibition of the importation of which is in his opiuion necessary in the public interest:

And whereas in the opinion of the Governor-General it is necessary in the public interest that the importation of tungsten and its alloys and compounds, also tungsten ores, should be prohibited to the extent and in the manner hereinsfter appearing:

Inafter appearing:
Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by section forty-six of the Customs Act, 1913, and section two of the Regulation of Trade and Commerce Amendment Act, 1915, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby prohibit the importation of tungsten and its alloys and compounds, also tungsten ores, into the Dominion of New Zealand save with the consent of the Minister of Customs.
