Special Shooting Season for Imported and Native Game, License Fee, &c., East Coast Acclimatization District.

LIVERPOOL, Governor-General.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by the Animals Protection Act, 1908, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby exempt from the operation of section twenty-six of the said Act the East Coast Acclimatization District, and do hereby notify that the following imported game—viz., cock pheasants and Californian quail—may be killed within the East Coast Acclimatization District, comprising the Counties of Cook, Waikohu, and Waiapu (except in the areas mentioned in the Schedule hereto), from the first day of May, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, to the thirty-first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, both days inclusive; and do hereby restrict the number of cock pheasants that may be killed by any one person in any one day to twelve. And I do further notify that licenses to kill such imported game within the said district shall be issued to any person on payment of the sum of twenty shillings each; and the Chief Postmaster at Gisborne is hereby appointed to sign and issue the said licenses to kill imported game.

And I do further notify that the following native game—viz., grey duck, teal, and black swan—may be killed within the above-mentioned district (except in the areas mentioned in the Schedule hereto) from the first day of May, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, to the thirty-first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, both days inclusive; and do hereby restrict the number of such native game that may be tilled by any one person in any one day to not more may be killed by any one person in any one day to not more than twenty-five head in all.

Station in Tuatawhata Survey District; thence by the leading spur and the western watershed of Te Hoe River to a point on the Hautapu River due east of Pohokura Trig. Station: Station; thence by a right line to Pohokura Trig. Station aforesaid; thence by the eastern watershed of the Mokoaforesaid; thence by the eastern watershed of the Moko-mokonui Stream to the Tataraokino Mountain; thence by

the leading spur to the confluence of the Mohaka and Waipunga Rivers; thence by the leading spur to Trig. Station 69A, Taraponui; thence by the leading spur and the southern watershed of the Waikare River to the sea at Mocangiangi; thence towards the east generally by high-water mark of the sea to the middle of the Waimata River, being the northeastern corner of Waimata Survey District in Akitio County; thence by the northern boundaries of Waimata and Mount Cerebus Survey Districts and the northern boundary of Wellington Land District to the middle of the Manawatu River; thence by the middle of the Manawatu River to a point in line with the summit of the Ruahine Range; thence to and by the summit of that range to a right line running between Aorangi Trig. Station and the confluence of the northern branch of the Waipawa River with the Makaroro River; thence by that line to Aorangi Trig. Station; thence by a right line running in the direction of trig. numbered 32 to the middle of the Rangitikei River, and by the middle of that river to the place of commencement.

HEREAS by section one hundred and twenty-seven of the Reserves and other Lands Disposal and Public Bodies Empowering Act, 1917, the Horowhenua County and all boroughs and town districts within the boundaries thereof were included in the Palmerston North Hospital District, and excluded from the Wellington Hospital District:

And whereas by Proclamation in the New Zealand Gazette on the twentieth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, the City of Wellington and the Borough of Onslow were constituted one united borough, and the bound-aries of the said city were so constituted as to include the

And whereas by section nine, subsection two, of the Hospitals and Charitable Institutions Act, 1909, it is enacted that the number of representatives of each contributory district on a Hospital Board shall be such as is determined from time to time in each case by the Governor-General by Order in Council:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the Hospitals and Charitable Institutions Act, 1909, doth hereby determine that the number of representatives of each of the contributory districts within the Wellington Hospital District shall be as set forth in the Schedule hereto, and that the first election of such representatives shall be held on Wednesday, the thirtieth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen; and doth hereby direct that the regulations made by Order in Council dated the third day of September, one thousand nine hundred dated the third day of September, one thousand nine hundred and seventeen, shall as far as applicable apply as if incor-porated in this Order in Courcil.

The following special order, made by the Christchurch City Council, is published in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1908.

CERISTCHURCH CITY COUNCIL.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by section 125 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1908, the Christchurch City Council hereby resolves by special order to create subdivisions in the City of Christchurch. The boundaries of the said subdivisions and their names and the number of Councillors to be elected in respect of each of them shall be as follows:-

Commencing at the junction of Bealey Avenue and Park Terrace; thence southerly along Park Terrace and Rolleston

Avenue to Lincoln Road; thence along Lincoln Road to Avenue to Lincoln Road; thence along Lincoln Road to Moorhouse Avenue; thence easterly along the centre of Moorhouse Avenue to its junction with Fitzgerald Avenue; thence northerly along the centre of Fitzgerald Avenue to the left bank of the River Avon; thence easterly along the left bank of the said River Avon to a point opposite the continuation of a line forming the northern boundary of a subdivision of Rural Section 197, containing 5 acres 2 roods; thence westerly along the northern boundary of the said subdivision to a road intersecting Rural Section 197; thence along the centern side of that road to a point opposite a prialong the eastern side of that road to a point opposite a private road in continuation of North Avon Road; thence westerly and southerly along the centre of the said private road and North Avon Road to the junction of the latter with Bealey Avenue; thence westerly along the centre of Bealey Avenue to the starting-point.
