Bounded towards the north-east by Section 21 in the said Block V, 1383·8 links; towards the east by the Maukoro Native Reserve, B Section 2, and B Section 1, 781·8 links; towards the south generally by Section 31 of the aforesaid Block V, Waitoa Survey District, 922·8, 567·7, 384·3, and 560·5 links; and towards the west generally by a public road, 178·4, 350·1, and 733·1 links: be all the aforesaid linkages more or less.
