OTAGO HUNT (INCORPORATED) CLUB. REGULATIONS.

(Under the Gaming Act, 1908.)

In pursuance and exercise of the powers in that behalf con tained in section 33 of the Gaming Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities it enabling in that behalf, the Otago Hunt (Incorporated) Club, a racing club within the meaning of the said Act (hereinafter referred to as "the said club"), doth hereby make the following regulations controlling the admission of persons to that part of the Wingatui Racecourse situated in the District of Otago and known as the Wingatui Racecourse, while the said racecourse is used or occupied by the said club for race meetings.

(b.) Bookmakers' ookmakers' clerks, bookmakers' assistants, and bookmakers' agents.

(c.) All persons under disqualification inflicted by any racing or trotting club in the Dominion of New Zealand, the Commonwealth of Australia, or elsewhere, if affiliated to the New Zealand Racing Conference, or the New Zealand Trotting Association, or the New Zealand Trotting Conference.

(d.) Common prostitutes, and persons who habitually consort with thieves or with persons who have no lawful

visible means of support.

(e.) Professional tipsters, persons convicted of house-breaking or pocket-picking, forgery, uttering or possessing counterfeit coin, theft, false pretences, receiving stolen goods, mischief, assault, or any offence or crime of any kind under the Crimes Act, 1908, and also idle and disorderly persons, rogues and vagabonds, and incorrigible rogues convicted under the Police Offences Act, 1908, and persons convicted of an offence under the Gaming Act,

The foregoing regulations of the Otago Hunt (Incorporated) Club were made and passed by the Otago Hunt (Incorporated) Club on the 17th day of March, 1919, and signed by the Chairman and Secretary.
