8. MAINTENANCE OF WORKS.

After the said works have been completed, the licensee shall maintain the same in proper working-order during the continuance of this license.

9. RIGHT TO ENTER LANDS, ETC.

The licensee shall have the right at any time or times during the continuance of this license, with the consent of the Minister, to enter upon any road or other land, whether vested in or occupied by the Crown or any other person or body corporate, and there to construct, erect, lay down, maintain, renew, or repair all such transmission-lines, poles, or other things as are required for the transmission of electricity between the generating-stations and any of the substations to which this license applies.

10. POWER TO TAKE LAND.

The licensee is hereby empowered to take, under the Public Works Act, 1908, as for a public work such land as may, in the opinion of the Governor-General, be necessary to enable the licensee to construct and maintain the various works authorized by this license.

11. DURATION OF LICENSE.

This license shall, unless sooner determined in accordance with the provisions hereinafter expressed, continue in force for a period of forty-two years from the date hereof. Upon the expiry of the said term, or upon the sooner determina-tion of this license by revocation or otherwise, all rights hereby granted to the licensee shall thereupon cease and determine; but such expiration or determination shall not relieve the licensee of any liability theretofore incurred under this license.

12. RENTAL.

The licensee shall, in respect of this license, pay to the Public Works Engineer for the district, or otherwise as the Minister may from time to time require, a rental of one peppercorn per annum if demanded

13. GRANTING OF OTHER WATER-RIGHTS.

Nothing herein shall prevent the Governor Ceneral in Council from granting to any person or body corporate other than the licensee a license to take water from any portion of the said river, except at the place where the licensee is by this license empowered to take it; provided that no such license shall so operate as to reduce the natural fall between the headworks and tail-water, or the volume of the water which the licensee is by this license authorized to take from the said river. the said river.

14. FINES.

If the licensee fails or neglects-

- (a.). To use or maintain the said works, after completion, so as to secure the full benefit of the undertaking; or
- (b.) To observe any of the conditions or obligations herein imposed,-

imposed,— then and in any such case the licensee shall be liable to a fine of £50 for every week or part of a week during which such default or neglect continues; or the Governor-General may by Order in Council revoke this license.

15. SERVICE OF NOTICE.

Notwithstanding anything in the last preceding clause, this license shall not be revoked, and no proceedings shall be taken for the recovery of a fine in respect of the breach thereof, unless and until notice in writing of the intention so to revoke the license or to take such proceedings has been served upon the licensee, or placed upon some principal or conspicuous part of the works, and default has been made

- General can be met by a fine, for thirty days after the service of such notice.
- (b.) For any breach which in the opinion of the Governor General is of such a nature as to require the revoca-tion of this license, for ninety days after the service of such notice.

16. VARIATION IN CONDITIONS OF LICENSE

The terms and conditions of this license may at any time or from time to time, at the request or with the consent in writing of the licensee, be altered by the Governor-General by Order in Council.

17. SURRENDER OF LICENSE.

The licensee may at any time, with the consent of the Minister, surrender this license, and shall thereupon, if so required by the Minister, remove from the ground all remov-able equipment, machinery, buildings, poles, transmission-

18. CHARGES FOR ELECTRIC ENERGY.

The charge for electrical energy shall not exceed 1s. per unit for lighting purposes, and 6d. per unit for motor-power, heating, or cooking purposes; provided that "lighting pur-poses" shall include the operation of motor generators for lighting purposes.

19. AREA OF SUPPLY.

The area of supply comprises the Opunake Survey Dis-trict (including the Town of Opunake), and that portion of the Oeo Survey District bounded on the north by the Opunake Survey District, on the west and south by the Tasman Sea, and on the east by the Oeo River, as indicated by a distinctive border coloured red on the plan marked P.W.D. 45414, deposited in the office of the Minister at Wellington, in the Land District of Wellington.

20. SYSTEM OF SUPPLY.

The system of supply shall be as described in paragraphs (c) and (c) of clause 2 of the regulations. The generating voltage shall be approximately 3,300 volts

between the terminals.

21. DATUM TEMPERATURE.

For the purposes of calculating stresses as provided in clause 12 of the regulations, the datum temperature shall be taken as 22 degrees Fahrenheit.

22. Notices re Extensions, etc.

Records of results of tests (Regulation 37), and notices re commencement of work (Regulation 37), and notices 7ecommencement of work (Regulation 44) and re extensions and alterations (Regulation 49), should be sent to the Under-Secretary, Public Works Department, Wellington, and to the Telegraph Engineer of the district, or his deputy, at present stationed at New Plymouth.

23. REQUIREMENTS OF EGMONT COUNTY COUNCIL.

Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, the licensee shall not be entitled to erect, maintain, or use any electric lines within the Egmont County except subject to such conditions, not inconsistent with the provisions of this license and the regulations relating thereto, or any variation of this license or the regulations, as may from which may take the place of these regulations, as may from time to time be agreed upon between the licensee and the Egmont County Council.

License authorizing the Auckland City Council to extend Electric Lines in the Borough of Mount Eden.

At the Government House at Wellington, this twenty-seventh day of May, 1919.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section two of the Public Works Amend-ment Act, 1911, it is provided that no person shall lay, construct, place, put up, or use any electric line except under the authority of a license issued by the Governor-General in Council under that Act :

And whereas by a license dated the first day of March, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, and published in the New Zealand Gazette of the eleventh day of March, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, the Auckland City Council was authorized to erect certain electric lines in portion of the Borough of Mount Eden:

And whereas the Auckland City Council (hereinafter referred to as "the licensee") desires to extend electric lines in the Borough of Mount Eden as defined in the Schedule hereto, and it is expedient accordingly to issue a license in respect thereof under the said section :

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the said section, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in that behalf, His Excel-lency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth, subject to the conditions
