### TIBATU BLOCK.

This block is tapped by two main roads (metalled)--the Raumati Road in the north-western corner, which is about two miles from Dannevirke, and the Tipapakuku Road in the south-western corner, which is about three miles and a quarter from Dannevirke. From these, connecting roads have been laid off through the block, and are now being formed. The most remote section (24) will be about eight miles from Dannevirke. There are two dairy factories handy, one at Raumati and the other at Tipapakuku, and schools at the same places. The block has been heavily timbered, but has been milled,
