"On and after 28th July, 1919, vessels proceeding through Dover Straits will no longer be boarded in the Downs for issue of route instructions unless they ask for them.

"Vessels entering North Sea and wishing to obtain latest mine-warnings must then pass through Downs, and by day fly flag "Y" of the International Code, and by night flash letter "Y" by Morse code till attended to by boarding-vessel, which should be closed in on. Boarding-vessel exhibits by day three black balls horizontal, by night three red lights horizontal."
