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Date of Commencement of Legislative Council Act, 1914.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by section four of the Legislative Council Amendment Act, 1918, it is enacted that the Legislative Council Act, 1914, shall (except as provided by sections two and five of the said first-mentioned Act) commence on a date to be appointed for the commencement thereof by Proclamation, and that the date so appointed shall not be within the period of twelve calendar months ensuing immediately after the publication of such Proclamation in the *Gazette*:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the power conferred upon me by the said Legislative Council Amendment Act, 1918, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and appoint that the Legislative Council Act, 1914, shall (except as provided by sections two and five of the Legislative Council Amendment Act, 1918) commence on the thirty-first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one.

Given under the hand of His Excellency the Right Honourable Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, Member of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Member of the Royal Victorian Order, Knight of Justice of the Order of Saint John of Jerusalem, Governor-General and Commander-in-Chief in and over His Majesty's Dominion of New Zealand and its Dependencies; and issued under the Seal of the said Dominion, at the Government House at Wellington, this twenty-third day of December, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and nineteen.

GOD SAVE THE KING!

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Lands withdrawn from State-forest Reservation.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the lands specified in the Schedule hereto are State forests under the control of the Commissioner of State Forests appointed under the State Forests Act, 1908 (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), and the said lands are now no longer required for State-forest purposes: And whereas plans showing the extent and position of the said lands, and a statement of the reasons why they are no longer required for State-forest purposes, have been laid before both Houses of Parliament for a period of thirty days, and no resolution has been passed by either of such Houses objecting to the issue of this Proclamation:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by section twenty-eight of the said Act, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in this behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the Proclamations specified in the said Schedule, so far as they relate to the lands described in the said Schedule, as from the date of the publication hereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*; and doth hereby proclaim and declare that from and after such date the parcels of land described in the said Schedule shall be no longer subject to the provisions of the said Act.

SCHEDULE.

AUCKLAND LAND DISTRICT.

ALL that area in the Auckland Land District, containing by admeasurement 270 acres, more or less, being Section 74, Block VIII, Katikati Survey District. Bounded towards the north-east by a public road-line, 260 links; towards the east by a line, 4138 links; towards the south-east by Section 37, the abutment of a road, by Section 63 (all of Block VIII aforesaid), and a line, 7446 links; towards the west by a line, 3855 links; and towards the north-west by Section 73 of Block VIII aforesaid, 2848 and 4689 links: be all the aforesaid linkages more or less.
