

*Regulations under Public Health Act, 1908.—Notification of Death from an Infectious Disease.*

**LIVERPOOL, Governor-General.**

WHEREAS by section eleven of the Public Health Amendment Act, 1919, it is provided that when any person has died of an infectious disease the undertaker, or other person having charge of the funeral of the deceased, shall forthwith, after having been informed of the cause of death and before the removal of the body from the building or other place in which it may then be, give notice to the District Health Officer of the fact of death and the cause thereof:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon him by section one hundred and eleven of the Public Health Act, 1908, and by the said section eleven of the Public Health Amendment Act, 1919, and of every other power and authority enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand doth hereby make the following regulations; and doth hereby declare that these regulations shall come into force on the publication thereof in the *Gazette*.

**REGULATIONS.**

1. WHERE the cause of death is any infectious disease, the notice required under section 11 of the Public Health Amendment Act, 1919, shall be given by post, and shall be in the form (A) in the Schedule hereto.

2. Without excluding the operation of Regulation 1, where the cause of death is influenza or acute primary pneumonia, the notice required under section 11 of the Public Health Amendment Act, 1919, shall be given by telegram, and shall be in the form marked (B) in the Schedule hereto.

3. Every notice under the first regulation shall be posted, postage being collect, and shall be transmitted free of charge to the sender; and, similarly, every telegram under Regulation 2 shall be marked "collect" and shall be transmitted free of charge to the sender.
