*Appointing Dates for Examination of Engineers in the Mercantile Marine at Whangarei and New Plymouth.*

WHEREAS by warrant dated the 5th day of December, 1918, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 163, of the 12th day of the same month, regulations were made fixing dates for examination of engineers in the mercantile marine throughout New Zealand :

And whereas it is desirable to amend such regulations in the manner hereinafter described :

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in me by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in that behalf, I do hereby amend the aforesaid regulations of the 5th day of December, 1918, by adding thereto the following regulation, namely :—

Examinations will be held at Whangarei and New Plymouth during the first three working-days in February, May, August, and November.

This regulation is to form part of and be read in conjunction with the aforesaid regulations of the 5th day of December, 1918.
