 - (d.) Erection and furnishing of town hall and municipal buildings, purchase of and laying-out of town-hall site, and all expenses incidental thereto: £6,000
 - (e.) Erection of swimming-bath: £600
 - (f.) Extension of borough waterworks, materials, fittings, labour, and engineering fees and contingencies: £9,500
 - (g.) Alterations to and extension of borough electrical system, including purchase of all necessary plant and machinery, poles, wire, &c., together with engineering fees and contingencies: £26,000
 - (h.) Installation of sewerage drainage system in the borough, £10,000; house connections for same, £5,000; engineering fees and contingencies, £1,000: £16,000
 - (i.) First year's interest and sinking fund: £1,900
- the number of votes recorded for the proposal was 157, and the number of votes recorded against the proposal was 88. I therefore declare that the proposal was carried.
