ALL that portion of the Mangateka Road, in the Taranaki Land District, Ohura County, commencing at a point opposite the south-east corner of Section 38 (school-site), Block I, Tangitu Survey District, and proceeding thence generally in an easterly direction, adjoining or passing through Sections 30, 32, and 36 (Crown land), Block I, Tangitu Survey District, to its junction with the Takiri Road; being a distance of seventy-two chains, more or less. ALL that portion of the Okahukura Service Road (comprising the Okahukura Road and portions of the Okoroa and Otahu Roads), in the Taranaki Land District, Ohura County, commencing at its junction with the Ongarue Valley Road (Te Kuiti-Taumarunui Road) near Okahukura Railway-station, and continuing thence generally in a north-westerly direction, adjoining or passing through Sections 2, 3, 5, Block II, 17, 16, Block I, Rangi Survey District, and Sections 7, 3, 9, and 10, Block XI, Tangitu Survey District, to its junction with Ohura Road; being a distance of 6 miles 72 chains, more or less.
