#### SCHEDULE I.

The regulations relating to the salaries of public-school teachers, made by Order in Council dated 17th November, 1919, are hereby amended as follows:

1. By adding the following proviso to subclause (1) of clause 2:— "Provided that the addition to the salary payable under this clause to a certificated teacher who has been a member of the New Zealand Expeditionary Force shall not be less than £30 if he is qualified, with respect to teaching and military service in accordance with subclause (3) of clause 3 of the regulations, to receive the benefit under paragraph (iv) of Schedule VI.

### SCHEDULE II.

The regulations relating to the house allowance of public-school teachers, made by the Order in Council dated 17th December, 1918,

are hereby amended by adding the following provise:—
"Provided that allowances shall be half the amounts prescribed above in the case of any school where a movable residence is provided."
