HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS the Whangarei Borough Council, acting under and in pursuance of section sixteen of the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1913, lately proposed to raise a loan of ten thousand pounds for the purpose of erecting workers' dwellings :

And whereas the special order authorizing the raising of the said loan is irregular, in so far that the term of the loan is stated as thirty years instead of thirty-six and one-half years :

And whereas it appears that the ratepayers have not been misled by the said irregularity or defect, and it is expedient to validate same :
