RESOLUTION STRIKING SPECIAL RATE.

NOTICE is hereby given that at a special meeting of the Mataura Borough Council held on the thirty-first day of May, 1920, the following resolution was duly carried:—

In pursuance of and in exercise of the powers vested in it in that behalf by the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1913, and of all other powers (if any) thereunto enabling it, the Mataura Borough Council hereby resolves as follows:—

That, for the purpose of providing for the payment of interest, sinking fund, and other charges of the Mataura Borough Electric-light Loan, 1920, of £1,100, authorized to be raised by the Council, under the above-mentioned Act, for the purpose of the reconstruction and extension of the electric-light works of the Borough of Mataura, the said Council hereby makes and levies a special rate of one and three-quarters pence in the pound sterling on the rateable value (on the basis of the annual value) of all rateable property in the Borough of Mataura; and that such special rate shall be an annually recurring rate during the currency of such loan, and be payable yearly on the first day of June in each and every year during the currency of such loan, being a period of ten years, or until the loan is fully paid off.
