## BIRTHS.

The births registered during June quarter numbered 7,412, a decrease of 119 on the number for the preceding quarter, but an increase of 1,276 when compared with June quarter, 1919. The birth-rate for the six months ended 30th June is equal to an annual rate of 25.51 per 1,000 of mean population, as compared with a rate of only 21.55 for the year 1919.
