WHEREAS by Order in Council dated the twenty-W HEREAS by Order in Council dated the twenty-second day of December, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, and published in the New Zealand Gazette of the twenty-third day of December, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, regulations were made under the authority of the Post and Telegraph Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), with respect to the transmission of messages by wieless telegraphy and charges to be by wireless telegraphy and fixing the fees and charges to be demanded and received therefor: And whereas it is desirable to amend such regulations in the manner hereinafter set forth :
