Fixing Rates and Charges for Connections with Telephone Exchanges and for Telephone Toll Communications.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE ADMINISTRATOR PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

W HEREAS by Order in Council dated the second day of August, one thousand nine hundred and twenty, and gazetted on the fifth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and twenty, regulations were made and rates and charges fixed under the authority of the Post and Telegraph Act, 1908 (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), for connections with telephone exchanges and for telephone toll communications: And whereas it is expedient to amend such regulations and rates
