

Altering the Middle-line of a Portion of the North Auckland Railway (Mareketu Section).

A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Public Works Act, 1908, and of all other powers in anywise enabling me in this behalf, I, Robert Stout, the Administrator of the Government of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby revoke the Schedule to the Proclamation dated the 31st day of July, 1915, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 93, of the fifth day of the following month, defining the middle-line of a further portion of the North Auckland Railway (namely, Mareketu Section) between the points marked 93 miles 40 chains and 97 miles, as shown on the plan numbered P.W.D. 38074 referred to in such Proclamation; and in lieu thereof do hereby proclaim and declare that the middle-line of the said portion of railway, commencing at the said point marked 93 miles 40 chains and terminating at 96 miles 62 chains, shall be as defined and set forth in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

COMMENCING at a point in Allotment 148, Paparoa Parish, marked 93 miles 40 chains on the line of railway defined by a Proclamation dated 31st July, 1915, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 93, of the fifth day of the following month, and proceeding thence generally in a northerly direction for a distance of 3 miles 22 chains, and passing in, into, through, or over the following lands, &c.—viz., Allotments 148, 141, 150, 147, Paparoa Parish; Allotments 194, 206, 209, and 228, Mareketu Parish; and terminating at a point in the said Allotment 228 marked 96 miles 62 chains (such point being opposite the point marked 97 miles on the plan numbered P.W.D. 38074 referred to in the Proclamation aforesaid, and situated on the eastern side of the middle-line defined by the said Proclamation, and being about 4 chains distant from and at right angles to such middle-line); including all adjoining and intervening places, lands, reserves, roads, tracks, lakes, rivers, streams, and watercourses.

In the Survey District of Matakoho, North Auckland Land District; as the same is delineated on the plan marked P.W.D. 49728, deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works at Wellington, in the Wellington Land District.
