

bearing 345° 21', distance 1098 links; bearing 344° 29', distance 10800 links; bearing 74° 30', distance 4500 links; bearing 9° 30', distance 6600 links; bearing 273°, distance 7500 links; bearing 315°, distance 1600 links; bearing 298° 30', distance 11800 links; bearing 267°, distance 2550 links; bearing 258°, distance 4500 links; and bearing 20° 29', distance 17000 links, to the southern boundary of Tauwhareparae No. 2B Block; thence by that block to the Mangamauku Stream; thence by that stream to the Mata River; thence by the right bank of the Mata River to the eastern boundary-line of Huiarau No. 1 Block; thence towards the west generally by the said Huiarau No. 1 Block, Waipaoa No. 2 Block, and Waipaoa No. 3B Block, to the Waingaromia River; thence to and along the middle of that river to the northernmost corner of Waingaromia No. 1C Block; thence by that block to the middle of the Waiapu Inland Road; thence by a line along the middle of that road to a point in line with the north-western boundary of Small Grazing-run 42; thence to and by that boundary and the northern and south-eastern boundaries of the said Small Grazing-run 42; thence on the south and west by Lot 1, Small Grazing-run 43A, to the centre of a road; thence by the centre of that road, running in a southerly direction through Small Grazing-run 43, to the junction of the road with a north-west boundary of Small Grazing-run 58, Lot 2; thence on the south by Small Grazing-run 58 to a point on the Mangarara Stream; thence on the south-west by portion of Small Grazing-run 58, Waimata North 1A 2, and again by Small Grazing-run No. 58; thence on the south by the northern boundary of the Waimata North No. 1 Block; thence on the south-east by the north-western boundary of Section 2, Block XIII, Waimata, to the Pakarae River; thence by the centre of the Pakarae River to the Pakarae No. 1 Block; thence on the south-west by the Pakarae No. 1 Block to the sea; thence on the east by the sea to Koa-gaumu, the starting-point, and including Pourewa Island.

A PROCLAMATION.

BY virtue and in exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by the State Forests Act, 1908, and of every other power and authority enabling me in that behalf, I, Robert Stout, the Administrator of the Government of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, do hereby set apart the forest lands described in the Schedule hereto, forming part of the Crown lands in New Zealand, as and for a State forest within the provisions of the said Act.

SCHEDULE.

WESTLAND LAND DISTRICT.

ALL that area of Crown lands in the Westland Land District, containing by admeasurement 1,100 acres, more or less, being part of Reserve 1462, Block IX, Kanieri Survey District, and bounded as follows:—

Commencing at the most westerly corner of Section 1219, and proceeding along the western boundary of State forest to and across the Hokitika River Road; thence along the western side of the said road to its intersection with the north-eastern boundary of Section 835, and along the said north-eastern boundary and the north-western boundary of the said Section 835, and along the south-western boundary and across the Hokitika River Road, and again by the south-western boundary of the said section to the most northerly corner of Section 1945, and along the north-western boundary of that section to the H.O. road line; thence along the said road-line to a point in line with the northern boundary of Section 2777; thence to and along the said section boundary across the Seddon Terrace Track, and again along the said northern boundary of Section 2777 to the H.I. road-line; thence along the eastern side of the said H.O. road-line; thence to and across the Seddon Terrace Track and across the H.O. road-line, and along the eastern side of the said Seddon Terrace Track to its junction with Seddon Terrace Road; thence across the said road and proceeding due east to and

across the Hokitika River Road; thence along the eastern side of the said road to its intersection with the north-western boundary of Reserve 1462, and along the said boundary to a road reserve fronting the Hokitika River; thence along the said road reserve and along a road reserve fronting the north-western boundary of Section 1139; thence along the said road reserve to a point in line with the south-western boundary of the said Section 1139; thence to and along the said boundary to the north-western boundary of Section 1219, and thence along the said boundary to point of commencement.
