

Position.—On summit of islet (200 feet) off eastern extreme of High Peak Island. Lat. 21° 57' S., long. 150° 43' E., on Chart No. 346.

Details:—

Character.—Flashing white light, showing one flash every five seconds, thus—flash $\frac{1}{2}$ sec., eclipse $4\frac{1}{2}$ secs.

Elevation.—215 feet.

Visibility.—20 miles.

Power.—5,000 candles.

Structure.—Lantern painted white, carried on square concrete cylinder house. Height, 22 feet.

Remarks.—The light will be unwatched. The light will be visible from about 110° (S. 78° E. mag.), through south, west, and north, to 40° (N. 32° E. mag.); obscured elsewhere.

The aforementioned quantity, quality, and kind as to the said timber shall be taken as sufficiently accurate for the purpose of this sale, and no contract for purchase shall be voidable, nor shall the purchaser be entitled to any abatement in price, by reason of the said timber being of less quantity, quality, and kind than as stated herein or in any advertisement having reference to the said timber, nor shall any extra sum be claimed by the Crown if the said quantity of timber is found to be in excess of that stated herein.
4. All timber, whether standing, felled, or in logs, shall remain the property of the Crown until paid for.
5. The quantity stated is standing measurement, and only those trees bearing the special distinguishing brand are included in the sale, but an offer may be made by the successful tenderer for the fourteen isolated kauri-trees not included in the sale.
6. Should any dispute arise as to the boundaries, the decision of the Commissioner of Crown Lands shall be final.
7. In the event of the lot not being disposed of, applications may be received and dealt with at any time within six months from date of sale (unless previously formally withdrawn); provided, however, that the amount offered is not less than the upset price stated herein.
8. Tenders must be accompanied by a deposit of 5 per cent. on the amount of tender in cash, marked cheque, or post-office order; the balance of the first payment to be paid within thirty days of date of accepting of tender.
