

(4.) Become bankrupt, or be in any manner brought under the operation of any law in force for the time being relating to bankruptcy,—
then and in any of the said cases this Order in Council, and every right, power, and privilege may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council, without any notice to the licensee or other proceeding whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the licensee, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the rights and privileges thereby conferred, have been revoked and determined; and upon such revocation the Minister may cause the said jetty to be removed, and may recover the costs incurred by any such removal from the licensee.

10. The construction of the jetty shall be deemed to be an acceptance by the licensee of the conditions of this Order in Council.
