THE following notice, relative to the issue of a memorial plaque and scroll to the next-of-kin of those members of the British mercantile marine who lost their lives through enemy action between 4th August, 1914 and 11 recoverber, 1918, has been received from the Board of Trade, and is published for general information.

His Majesty the King has been graciously pleased to sanction a memorial being presented to the next-of-kin of all those members of the British, Dominion, Colonial, and Indian mercantile marine (including licensed pilots, fishermen, and crews of pilotage and lighthouse authorities vessels, and of Post Office cable ships) who have lost their lives through enemy action while serving on British ships, and to the enemy action while serving on British ships, and to the next-of-kin of British members of the crews of neutral or allied vessels under the direct control of the Admiralty or the Ministry of Shipping who have lost their lives through enemy action while serving on such vessels between 4th August, 1914, and 11th November, 1918. This memorial is to take the form of a bronze plaque of emblematic design as issued in respect of the combatant services and a parchment scroll with appropriate wording, each of which will bear the deceased's Christian names and surname. The memorials will be accompanied by a letter from His Majesty
