WHEREAS it is provided by section two hundred and seven of the Harbours Act, 1908 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), that a Harbour Board may from time to time, by by-laws made under the said Act, do all or any of the things set forth in the said section:

And whereas it is provided by section nine of the said

Act that in any harbour where there is no Board, or where any Board is dissolved under the powers contained in the said Act, the Governor-General in Council shall have all the said Act, the Governor-General in Council shall have all the powers, functions, duties, and authorities by this Act conferred upon Harbour Boards, and may exercise the same in accordance with the said Act, and that any power or authority conferred upon the Governor-General in Council which, in the case of a Harbour Board, would be exercised by or under by-laws to be made by such Board shall and may be exercised under regulations to be made by Order in Council
