Extending Rating-powers of Huntly Town Board.

At the Government Buildings at Wellington, this 3rd day of May, 1921.

Present: THE HONOURABLE SIR F. H. D. BELL, K.C.M.G., PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is provided by section forty-one of the Finance Act, 1920, that the Governor-General may, by Order in Council, on the recommendation of a Commission appointed under the said section, increase the rating-powers of the Huntly Town Board to such extent as the Governor-General deems advisable, anything to the contrary in any

Act notwithstanding: And whereas a Commission appointed under the said section held inquiries, and recommended that the rating-powers of the said Board be increased, and it is desirable to increase such rating-powers in manner hereinafter appearing :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by the said section forty-one of the Finance Act, 1920, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby declare that, notwith-standing anything contained in the Town Boards Act, 1908, or any other Act, it shall be lawful for the said Huntly Town Board to have general rates in grade waves and the stable Board to levy general rates in each year on all rateable property within the district of the said Board, but so that property within the district of the said Board, but so that the maximum general rate in any year shall not exceed two-pence in the pound on the capital value of rateable property, or its equivalent on the unimproved value, or two shillings and sixpence in the pound on the annual value, as the case may be; and doth hereby further declare that such authority as aforesaid shall take effect in respect of general rates to be made and levied by the said Town Board during the financial year ending the thirty-first day of March, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one.

DURSUANT to the powers vested in me by the Animals Protection Act, 1908, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby notify and declare that the area described in the Schedule hereto shall be a sanctuary for the purposes of the said Animals Protection Act, and that no imported or native game shall be taken or killed within the said area.

SCHEDULE.

ALL that area in the Auckland Land District, commencing at the northernmost corner of Allotment 409, Whangamarino Parish, bounded on the north-east by a public road to and across the Auckland–Wellington Railway at the south end of the Te Kauwhata Railway-station; thence in a south-east direction by a right line to a point on the north-west boundary of Allotment 296, Parish of Whangamarino, and distant twenty chains from the east side of the Auckland–Wellington Railway-line; thence by a line parallel to and distant twenty chains from the aforesaid railway to the road on the right bank of the Onetea River; thence by the said road to Allotment 478 of the aforesaid parish; thence by the said Allotment 478 and its western boundary produced to the Onetea River; thence by the Onetea River aforesaid to its confluence with the Waikato River; thence by the right bank of the said river to a point the production of the east side of Mercer

Street (Town of Rangiriri); thence by a right line to and by the east side of said street to its junction with the Great South Road, across and by the said Great South Road to its junction with a public road, forming the north-western boundary of Allotment 409 aforesaid; thence along the said road to the northernmost corner of Allotment 409 aforesaid, the point of commencement.
