A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by the Public Works Act, 1908, and of every other power and authority in anywise enabling me in this behalf, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that the middle-line of a further portion of the Lawrence-Roxburgh Railway shall be that defined and set forth in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

COMMENCING at a point in Crown land, Block IV, Beaumont Survey District, marked 35 miles 45 chains, which point is also the termination of the railway described in a Proclamation dated the 25th day of May, 1911, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 45, of the 1st day of June, 1911, and proceeding thence generally in a north-westerly direction for a distance of 14 miles 15 chains, and passing in, into, through, or over the following lands, &c.—viz., Crown land, Section 11, Block IV, Run 170E, Section 8, Block VII, Run 170B, Section 9, Block VII, all in the Beaumont Survey District; Run 170, Sections 14, 16, and mining reserve in Block XII, and Sections 60, 59, 58, 57, 38, 37, 36, 35, 34, 64, and road reserve, Block III, Bengier Survey District; and terminating on the road reserve at a point marked 49 miles 60 chains: including all adjoining and intervening places, lands, reserves, roads, tracks, lakes, rivers, streams, and watercourses: all in the Otago Land District.
