Revoking Part of a Proclamation taking Additional Land at Kaiwarra for the Purposes of the Wellington-Napier Railway.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the Public Works Amendment Act, 1909, it is enacted that if at any time after the issue or making of any Proclamation taking land under the Public Works Act, 1908, and before the payment or award of any compensation in respect of the taking thereof, it is found that the land or any part thereof is not required for the purpose for which it was taken the Governor-General may, by a subsequent Proclamation gazetted, revoke the former

Proclamation, either wholly or so far as he thinks necessary:

And whereas it is found that part of the land at Kaiwarra taken for the purposes of the Wellington-Napier Railway by a Proclamation made under the Public Works Act, 1908, dated the fifth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and twenty (hereinafter termed "the said Proclamation"), and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 25, of the eleventh day of March, one thousand nine hundred and twenty, pages 786 and 787, is not required for the purposes for which it was taken:

Now, therefore, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in me by the Public Works Amendment Act, 1909, and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, do hereby revoke so much of the said Proclamation as affects the land described in the Schedule hereto.
