Notice fixing the Closing-hours of all the Grocers' Shops in the City of Nelson, under the Shops and Offices Act, 1908.

WHEREAS a requisition in writing, signed by a majority of the occupiers of all the grocers' shops in the City of Nelson, has been forwarded to me, desiring that all such shops in the city shall be closed in the evening of working-days as follows: On Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays, at 5.30 p.m., on Fridays at 6 p.m., and on Saturdays at 5 p.m.; provided that should the occupier of any shop affected by this requisition observe, pursuant to the Shops and Offices Act, 1908, Saturday as the statutory closing-day, then and in such case the closing-hour on Wednesday for any such shop shall be 5.30 p.m.:

And whereas I, George James Anderson, Minister of Labour, am satisfied that the signatures to such requisition represent a majority of the occupiers of all the grocers' shops within the City of Nelson:

Now, therefore, in pursuance of section 25 of the Shops and Offices Act, 1908, I do hereby direct that on and after the 1st day of August, 1921, all the grocers' shops within the City of Nelson shall be closed in the evening of working-days as follows: On Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays, at 5.30 p.m., on Fridays at 6 p.m., and on Saturdays at 5 p.m.; provided that should the occupier of any shop affected by this requisition observe, pursuant to the Shops and Offices Act, 1908, Saturday as the statutory closing-day, then and in such case the closing-hour on Wednesday for any such shop shall be 5 p.m., in pursuance of section 41 of the War Legislation and Statute Law Amendment Act, 1918.

The notices published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the 18th January, 1906, and the 20th December, 1906, respectively, fixing the closing-hours of grocers' shops in the City of Nelson, are hereby cancelled as from the date of coming into operation of this notice.
