

6. (a.) Waimangaroa and Denniston, twice daily.
 (b.) Denniston and Burnett's Face, daily.
7. §¶ Westport, Corbyvale, Te Namu, Kongahu, Arapito, Karamea Ferry, Market Cross, and Karamea, twice weekly.
8. Westport, Addison's, and Charleston, twice weekly.
9. Westport : Vessels in harbour, Railway-station, and Chief Post-office, as required.
10. §¶ Westport, Tiroroa, Berlin's, Inangahua Junction, Inangahua Landing, Rotokohu, Cronadun, and Reefton, daily. (Tenderers have the option of tendering for this service for periods of either three or five years.)

Tenderers are to understand that they may tender for a service to commence from either terminal.

Tenderers are requested to clearly specify the mode of conveyance in the space for that purpose in the form of tender.

Contractors are not required to convey parcel-post parcels (except express transit parcels) to offices served by rail or steamer.

The lowest or any tender will not necessarily be accepted.

The attention of tenderers is directed to the terms and conditions of contract printed at the back of the tender forms.

Successful tenderers will be required to show that they are in a position to satisfactorily carry out the services.

Forms of tender, with the terms and conditions of contract, may be procured at any post-office.

No tender will be considered unless made on the printed form.

Tenders, endorsed "Tenders for Mail-service, No. ,," to be addressed to the Chief Postmaster of the postal district to which the tender may specially refer.
