"GUMTOWN" AND "CABBAGE BAY."—CHANGE OF NAME.

NOTICE is hereby given, by Proclamations given under the hand of His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, and issued under the Seal of the Dominion at Government House, Wellington, on the fifth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, and on the nineteenth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, the name of the locality known as "Gumtown," in the County of Coromandel, was altered to "Coroglen," and the name of the locality known as "Cabbage Bay," and the bay adjacent thereto also known as "Cabbage Bay," in the County of Coromandel, was altered to "Colville" and "Colville Bay" respectively.

The Proclamation in the case of "Gumtown" taking effect as from the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-two, and in the case of "Cabbage Bay" taking effect as from the first day of March, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-two.
