A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the Scenery Preservation Board, constituted pursuant to the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), has recommended that the land described in the Schedule hereto should be permanently reserved for scenic purposes, and it is expedient to give effect to such recommendation:

Now, therefore, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto shall be a scenic reserve under the said Act, and subject to the provisions thereof.

WHITIKAU SCENIC RESERVE.

All that area in the Hawke's Bay Land District, containing by admeasurement 81 acres 2 roods, more or less, and being portion of Section 2, Block I, Urutawa East Survey District. Bounded towards the north-east by the boundary-line between Hawke's Bay and Auckland Land Districts, 7446 links; towards the south-west generally by a public road; and towards the north-west by Section 1, Block I, Urutawa East Survey District, 1668.6 links: be all the aforesaid linkages more or less. As the same is delineated on the plan marked L. and S. 20/104, deposited in the Head Office, Department of Lands and Survey, at Wellington, and thereon bordered red.
